

This book features 92 haikus, one for each club in the English Premier and Football League pyramid. A haiku is a Japanese poem that typically consists of three lines, with five syllables in the first line, seven in the second, and five in the third. For purists, they should contain a seasonal reference. Well, these reference an entire season — 2025/26!

This is where the 'highbrow' element of this book starts and finishes, for this is essentially a quiz, layered with clues for you to guess the identities of the 92 teams represented.

There are nods to British popular culture, famous commentary lines, managers, players and fans, terrace chants (our title is testament to that), grounds, club crests, nicknames and even some Latin mottos. The Japanese characters that accompany each poem offer a further clue to the bilingual or indeed smartphone-owning reader.

If you're a football fan, or a trivia fiend (or you know someone that is), it's time to answer the ultimate football question — who the f*cking hell haiku?
